



# COURSE OUTLINE 2009-2010

<b>COURSE NAME:</b>	Music	<b>LEVEL:</b>	Cycle 2, Year 1
<b>COURSE CODE:</b>	669-304	<b>PERIODS PER CYCLE:</b>	3

The objective of this course is to develop the student's ability to express herself and communicate through music. She will work to develop her performance and listening skills, and will be given opportunities to share her musical ideas and to make critical assessments about the music around her.

## **Subject Area Competencies:**

1.	<b>The student creates musical works</b>
30%	-The student will expand her musical literacy by studying more advanced techniques of playing a musical instrument. -Using this knowledge, the student will compose more complex pieces of music
<i>Activity Types in this competency:</i> -Student knowledge of musical language and sound production will be further expanded by using the music theory and instrument book "Accent on Achievement Book 2". -Opportunities will be given to experiment with elements of music composition using a variety of rhythms, pitches, dynamics, and articulations in order for students to create their own pieces and perform them for their peers	
2.	<b>The student performs musical works</b>
40%	-More choices of musical instruments will be provided, and the student will build on playing skills to develop more advanced techniques of performance -The student will become more familiar with the expressive nature of music and how to use musical language to communicate emotions and ideas
<i>Activity Types in this competency:</i> -Playing musical selections from different periods, cultures, and styles while practicing at home and in class. Regular testing & Performance exams will demonstrate how well the student has developed these skills -Performance in the Winter and/or Spring Concerts -Students will be presented with a wide range of Concert Band repertoire and are invited to participate in both the Junior and Senior Band, according to interest and ability	
3.	<b>The student appreciates musical works(forms and makes opinions of musical works)</b>
30%	-The student will continue to critique music and to form her own opinions. -The student will continue to explore music from various cultures, time periods and styles.
<i>Activity Types for this competency:</i> -Listening classes where the students and teacher have provided music to critique. -Exploring a wide range of compositions from their new theory book and selected repertoire. -Discussions regarding the impact of music on oneself and society as a whole.
